Béatrice Perier Agostini Becomes Administrator of the QAM.

Saint-Hubert, QC, October 9th, 2021.

The Québec Aerospace Museum's Board of Directors was enlarged with the appointment on September 15 of Ms. Béatrice Perier Agostini as administrator for the promotion of the place of women in the aerospace industry.

Béatrice is from Toulon on the French Riviera in France. She holds a Master's degree from the IPAG School of Management in Nice as part of a double international course as well as a Master's degree in High-Tech Marketing specialty obtained in Toulouse. She began her career at the international in the field of telecommunications, notably at British Telecom in London.

In June 2010, she immigrated to Quebec with her family and in February 2019 obtained her Canadian citizenship.

In 2015, she joined MDA as marketing and communication manager at the company's Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue division which specializes in the design, assembly, integration and testing of satellites. This facility also supports MDA's robotics division located in Brampton, Ontario.

Béatrice has been very involved with inspiring the next generation. She has been an administrative member of the Cosmodôme Foundation since 2019, helping underprivileged and "at risk" children easily access activities and programs offered by the Cosmodôme.

In August 2019, she joined the Quebec aerospace cluster Aéro Montréal as Director in charge of succession and workforce. It is in this capacity that she is responsible, in particular, for the Regroupement Relève d'Aéro Montréal (RRAM), a multidisciplinary community of students, young graduates and professionals in the aerospace field.

A mother of two daughters currently aged 11 and 13, she has made her involvement in diversity and inclusion a personal and professional priority. This is one of the strategic priorities of Aéro Montréal's workforce initiative. In 2020, she also collaborated on the publication of a white paper on "Equity, Diversity and Inclusion" and is involved in several organizations working with minorities. Béatrice believes that the aerospace industry needs to move beyond its traditional sources of labour and focus on diversity as a source of future innovation and growth.

Béatrice is a mentor on Academos, the virtual mentoring platform, and she also participates in the annual community campaigns of the coalition for school perseverance.

It is with great pleasure that the QAM Board of Directors welcomes Béatrice to its team. Her enthusiastic, positive, sociable, communicative and spontaneous character will be an asset to the Museum and the diverse community it serves.
