**CAE joins the Québec Aerospace Museum
as the institution's first "Platinum" corporate member**

Saint-Hubert, QC, July 2, 2023. CAE Inc., the world leader in simulation, has joined the Québec Aerospace Museum (QAM) as a corporate member. CAE is a world leader in training for civil aviation, defense forces and healthcare professionals. A Canadian company headquartered in Montreal, QC, CAE is the QAM's first "Platinum" category member, and has agreed to a membership of two years, underscoring the company's commitment to supporting and actively participating in the museum's development.

The funds obtained through this membership will be used to finalize the acquisition and restoration of a Twin Engine simulator dating from 1958. It was offered to the QAM last year by a private owner, Mr. André Bourassa.

This simulator, of which CAE produced 12 units for the Royal Canadian Air Force, was intended for crew training for twin-engine aircraft, mainly the Douglas C-47 Skytrain/Dakota and the Fairchild C-119 Flying Boxcar.

The simulator was acquired by Mr. Bourassa approximately 40 years ago and maintained in meticulous working order during the time that it was in his possession. As an exceptional example of the aerospace industry in Quebec and Canada, the simulator will be on public display at the QAM in the near future.

"CAE's joining the QAM as a corporate member is great news for our organization," says Pierre Gillard, President and General Manager of the QAM. "Thanks to this support, the QAM will be able to showcase a flight simulator representing a part of the early history of CAE, and thus showcase the innovative vision of this company to the public at large, especially among younger generations. Of course, we would like to thank CAE for their generous support."
