Gilbert McCauley is back to the QAM Board of Directors

Saint-Hubert, QC, February 5th, 2024.

The Extraordinary General Meeting of the members of the Québec Aerospace Museum (QAM) on January 31st, 2024, elected a new member to sit on its Board of Directors. Mr. Gilbert McCauley, Lieutenant-Colonel (Retired), MSM, CD, former Commanding Officer of the 438 *Wildcats* Tactical Helicopter Squadron (438 ETAH) in St-Hubert from 2014 to 2016, now holds the position of Vice-President. A founding member and first past President of the QAM, he is delighted to return to the Board of Directors and is replacing Suzanne Benoit who recently retired for personal reasons.

The Saint-Hubert airport and our new Vice-President paths crisscrossed many times. Benefiting from a motor piloting scholarship from the Air Cadet League, he obtained his wings and his private pilot's license at the Won-Del Aviation school during the summer of 1974. After serving as a Medical Assistant with the 8th Medical Company of Sherbrooke, and a deployment with the Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus, he transferred to the Regular Forces in 1982. In 1984, he earned his pilot wings at the Canadian Forces Base Portage La Prairie, MB.

Having developed his skills in helicopter operations to support the Canadian Army and Special Forces with the CH-135 *Twin Huey*, then the CH-146 *Griffon*, he has had seven flying assignments across five squadrons. He also deployed overseas to Egypt, Haiti and twice to Afghanistan, all punctuated by (too) numerous staff assignments at the Strategic, Operational and Tactical levels. Putting aside his 10,000 hours with *PowerPoint* (!), he has accumulated more than 4,500 hours of flight time, including 4,000 hours on helicopters. Given that most of his hours were flown within 50 feet above the ground, he admits to being prone to vertigo!

Among his proudest accomplishments are the introduction and development of night tactical operations with the help of night vision goggles (NVGs); the operations with the *Sperwer* Tactical Uninhabited Air Vehicle in Kabul and Kandahar and, the highlight, was the honor of commanding the Royal Canadian Air Force's 438 ETAH based in Saint-Hubert.


Considering that retirement is, in fact, but a concept after a military career spanning more than 43 years, he was seduced to join the *Remotely Piloted Aerial Systems* (RPAS, commonly known as Drones) regulatory development team at Transport Canada.

Eager to preserve our aerospace history, to promote it and to motivate our next generation, it is with great enthusiasm that, along with his proud colleagues Pierre Gillard and Éric Tremblay, he was one of the founders of the QAM. With his knowledge of military and civilian aeronautics, he is ready to continue the task of recognizing and expanding the QAM.
